Preparing for a newborn can be a difficult task. EHS staff works with you as a pregnant mother, starting in your second trimester, to prepare you for parenting. Parenting a newborn, infant or toddler is a rewarding yet challenging experience. Early Head Start is a FREE early childhood development program staffed by caring professionals that help you succeed at being your child's first teacher.

Through a weekly visit to your home, and two playgroups a month, Early Head Start staff will help you accomplish the following.

- Prepare for the birth of your child.
- Enhance the growth of infants, toddlers, and children.
- Development of effective parenting skills.
- Collaborate with community agencies in supporting needs and goals.

Services offered by EARLY HEAD START

Home Visits

Early Head Start staff work with parents to support their child's development. Visits are weekly, last 90 minutes, and are planned by both the parent and the EHS Home Visitor together.

Playgroups

Twice a month, you and your child will have the opportunity to attend a playgroup (called Socialization). This is a chance for you to meet other parents and for the children to interact with one another.

Health Services

Early Head Start staff work with your family to ensure that your child is up-to-date on a regular schedule of immunizations and wellchild checks.

Developmental Screenings

Early Head Start Specialists will provide regular developmental screenings for your child. These screenings help to ensure that your child is developing appropriately, and help in setting goals.
